All school offices will be open starting Tuesday, August 29 to assist you with questions about the first day of school.

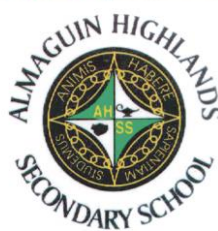
