Business Arising from the Minutes

Presentation on NNDSB Suspension/Expulsion/Exclusion Data by Emily Samuel (Safe Schools Principal)

The Safe Schools Team provided the committee with an overview of the Safe Schools framework and how it supports preventative measures and encourages positive student conduct. The team also shared information regarding exclusions and reviewed the use of exclusions within the NNDSB. The Team reiterated that exclusions are only issued for safety and not for staff shortages. The Safe Schools team provided an overview of suspensions, highlighting how student misconduct incidents decline from Grades 9 to 12.



Sharing of Information Re Gateway Community Hub – presented by Lana St. Louis, Mental Health Lead.

Lana St. Louis presented a power point presentation about details of some of these community partners.

Presentation by NNDSB Behaviour Team: A Summary of the Behaviour Support Model Lisa Mason North Region, Kelly Hingley BCA and Derek Lindeman, East and West Region

The team discussed the various staffing supports within the Board to support students with Behavioural needs. They also shared with us the details of the referral process. Behaviour support services data from the 2022-23 school year was shared.

Spec Ed Staffing and Programs

Principal Pauli indicated there were no changes to the staffing model presented in the Special Education Plan last June, with the exception of one additional teacher to be explained further in the Special Education update (below).

Correspondence received (Letter from Dufferin Peel Catholic DSB regarding retention and recruitment of Educational Assistant Staff)

We recently had a request from the media about how many positions that we have, vacancies, etc. SO Graves sharing 190 EA positions inclusive of temporary and permanent. We continue to struggle finding replacement/supply EAs. We have about 7 available temporary EA postings up on the portal, and we continue to actively recruit.

Trustee Sargent requested more information, and that the budget presentation next month include specific information around funding for EAs.

Ministry/MACSE updates:

SO Graves reviewed the MACSEA updates

- The Better Schools and Student Outcomes Act was passed June 8, 2023 and a number of details have been released to school boards since.
- PPM 151 PA Day Transparency Regulation: we submit a professional development plan to the Ministry and a summary of the PD must be posted on the board's website.



- Updated Transitional Certificate Regulation: A teacher working on their certification can have an interim certificate to take on some of the duties after they have at least 30 credits and 40 practicum days completed
- Additional Qualifications in Holocaust Education and Countering Antisemitism to be created and made available in the future/
- PPM 168: Year 2 of kindergarten, and Grade 1 and 2 students must be screened for early reading skills. Protected time for Grades 1-3 for foundational reading instruction is also addressed.
- PPM 169 school board and community partners will continue to work together for consistent mental health and well-being services across the province.
- PPM 124 Community Involvement Graduation Requirement: Students can start collecting volunteer hours after they finish grade 8, and before they start grade 9. Organizations who are taking on volunteers of special needs students they have a requirements/training that they get that training through that organization. Clarifies ineligible and eligible activities.
- PPM 132 PLAR: prior Learning Assessment and Recognition for Mature Students:
 Amendments make it easier for individuals who have not graduated secondary school but have expertise acquired through other post-secondary training to gain a credential toward meaningful employment.

 This is a Special Education funded position, with coordination alongside our Program
 Department. Gail will be supporting effective instruction in Math for students with learning
 difficulties.
- Our team is actively working on presentation for the PD Day on Sept 29th on IEP goal-setting and alignment with assessment.
- EAs are participating in regional PD equity, trauma, behaviour management systems, strategies to support students with behavioural challenges, etc.
